



PEEL'S REALITY

- The number of domestic violence cases in 2010 rose 6% in 2009 (from 14,113 to 13,319).
- 171,030 Peel residents or 14.8% of the region's population reported a disability.
- 1 in 5 persons will experience diagnosable mental health problems or illnesses in their lifetime; in Peel that represents 259,362 residents.
- There are long wait lists for mental health services, addiction treatment, and counselling for victims of abuse.
- Over 20,000 immigrants settle in Peel (Brampton, Caledon, Mississauga) each year; 48.6% of the Region's residents are newcomers

FOCUSED INVESTMENT STRATEGY

- Provide support to those who have been abused, including women, children, seniors and men
- Support people facing challenges related to mental health and disabilities
- Work to increase public awareness of mental health and mental illness and reduce stigmatization of racialized communities.
